



**Academic Upper Extremity
Orthopaedic Surgeon
Vancouver, BC**

The Department of Orthopaedics at St. Paul's Hospital and Providence Health Care is actively seeking an Orthopaedic Surgeon with Upper Extremity Fellowship training for a full-time position within the Department. The successful candidate will begin with a 2 year full-time provisional term, with potential to move to full-time active status thereafter.

The clinical focus of the position will include complex shoulder, elbow and wrist/carpus reconstruction as well as management of complex trauma in these anatomic regions. Provision of on-call emergency service is a requirement with capability in the management of general orthopaedic trauma expected.

Qualified applicants will hold an MD degree (or equivalent) and will have completed post-graduate and fellowship requirements prior to appointment. They will hold or be eligible for licensure with the BC College of Physicians and Surgeons and be certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Orthopaedic Surgery.

The successful candidate will have excellent interpersonal skills and a strong record of working collaboratively with others in a multidisciplinary environment. Eligibility for membership in the University of British Columbia (UBC) Department of Orthopaedics is a requirement, as there will be involvement in teaching UBC medical students, residents, and fellows. The successful candidate must demonstrate strong potential for contributions in scholarly research.

St. Paul's Hospital is a downtown teaching hospital in Vancouver, serving the urban core and a diverse population. It functions as a tertiary care center for patients from across British Columbia. It is a level 3 trauma centre. The Department of Orthopaedics is currently comprised of 9 full-time members with academic subspecialty interests in upper extremity reconstruction, foot & ankle, and arthroplasty.

Providence Health Care and UBC hire on the basis of merit and are committed to employment equity. We encourage all qualified persons to apply, however, Canadians and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.
